TERMINOLOGIES

- 1) "Academic Session" means academic year from July to June.
- 2) "Year" means the period commencing from 1st day of July and ending 30th June following.
- 3) "Semester" means a period of six months beginning from July to December and January to June of each academic session containing equivalent to 90 actual teaching days.
- 4) "Credit" means the unit by which the course work is measured. It is equivalent to one hour of teaching (Lecture or Tutorial) or two hours of Practical work/Field work per week.
 - a) 1 Credit = 1 Theoatical period of one hour duration
 - b) 1 Credit = 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration
 - c) 1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two hour duration
 - d) 1 credit course is equivalent to a course of 15 hours.
- 5) "Letter Grade" means an index of the performance of students in a said course. Grades are allotted by letters O, E,A,B,C,P and F (Fail).
- 6) "Grade Point" means a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10 point scale.
- 7) "Credit Point" means the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.
- 8) "Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)" means a measure of performance of a student in a semester. It is the ratio of total credit point secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places. "Grade Card or Transcript" means a certificate issued to all registered students after every semester displaying the course details along with SGPA of that semester.

9) "Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)" means a measure of cumulative performance of students over all semesters. It is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all semesters. It is also expressed up to two decimal places.

TYPES OF DEGREE COURSES

Honours Courses

The degree will be awarded on the Subject of Study in case of BA Honours and BSc Honours. If a student studying BCom Honours the degree will be awarded as "B.Com Honours". If a student studying BSc Honours with Mathematics the degree will be awarded as "BSc Honours In Mathematics". If a student studying BA Honours with Philosophy the degree will be awarded as "BA Honours In Philosophy".

Program Courses

BSC Program Course: A Student of BSC Program Course will select 3 Disciplines (Subjects) as courses of study. The degree will be awarded on Discipline A.

Example: Following is the selected courses of a student for BSc Program course Discipline A: Physics, Discipline B: Chemistry, Discipline C: Botany. The degree will be awarded "BSc Program With Physics".

BA Program Course: A Student of BA Program Course will select 2 Disciplines (Subjects) as courses of study and 3rd Discipline is Language Core Course. The degree will be awarded on Discipline A.

Example: Following is the selected courses of a student for BA Program course Discipline A: Philosophy Discipline, B: Music, Discipline C: Language Core Course. The degree will be awarded as "BA Program With Philosophy".

BCom Program Course:

The degree will be awarded as "BCom Program".

Honours Courses

As earlier, SKB University is offering Honours Courses. Students of Honours Courses require to study following courses of Honours Subject in 3 years. 14 Core Courses

- 4 Discipline Specific Elective Courses
- ii. 2 Skill Enhancement Courses

The following non-departmental courses are also to be studied as part of the honours Course.

- i. 4 Generic Elective Courses
- ii. 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (Environmental Studies and one from Compulsory English/ Bengali /Hindi)

Program Courses

Under the new system SKB University is offering Program Courses instead of Pass/ General Course. Pass/ General Course.

BSC Program Course:

Students of BSC Program Course require to study following courses from selected disciplines in 3 years.

- i. 12 Core Courses (Discipline A-4 courses, Discipline B-4 Courses, Discipline C-4 Courses)
- ii. 6 Discipline Specific Elective Courses (Discipline A-2 courses, Discipline B-2 Courses, Discipline C-2 Courses)
- iii. 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (From Discipline A)

The following non-departmental courses are also to be studied as part of the Course.

i. 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (Environmental Studies and one from Compulsory English/ Bengali /Hindi)

BA Program Course:

Students of BA Program Course require to study following courses from selected disciplines in 3 years.

- i. 8 Core Courses (Discipline A-4 courses, Discipline B-4 Courses) and
 - 4 Language Core Courses out of which 2 Courses on English & 2 courses on Bengali/Hindi)
