Observance of 14th August as a Day of Remembrance of the Partition of Bengal and its Tragic Consequences

Background and Objective:

The Partition of Bengal in 1947, which accompanied the wider partition of the Indian subcontinent, remains one of the most consequential and tragic episodes in the modern history of the region. It resulted in large-scale displacement, communal violence, and enduring social and psychological trauma for millions of people on both sides of the newly drawn border. In keeping with the Government of India's decision to observe 14th August as "Partition Horrors Remembrance Day," the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Panchakot Mahavidyalaya organized a commemorative programme to reflect upon this defining moment of the subcontinent's

history and to sensitize students and faculty members to its long-term social, cultural, and political ramifications.

Proceedings of the Programme:

The programme was held on 14th August 2026 at 12:30 PM in the Panchakot Mahavidyalaya Auditorium, and was attended by approximately 50 participants comprising faculty members and students of the college.

The event commenced with the National Song and National Anthem, followed by an introductory lecture delivered by Dr Saptarshi Chakraborty, Principal of the college, who set the context for the day's observance and underlined the institutional commitment to remembering and reflecting upon significant chapters of national history.

This was followed by an address from Dr. Jayanta Das, Coordinator of the IQAC, who spoke briefly to the gathered audience on the significance of the occasion and the objectives behind organizing the programme.

The keynote lecture of the day was delivered by Prof. Jaya Biswas, Assistant Professor, Department of History, Panchakot Mahavidyalaya, who spoke in detail on the Partition of Bengal and its tragic consequences, situating the discussion within the broader historical and human context of the events of 1947.

The programme concluded with a formal vote of thanks proposed by Dr. Suvajit Halder, Assistant Professor, Department of History, Panchakot Mahavidyalaya.

Feedback Analysis:

A total of 18 teacher feedback forms were received. Across the eight parameters, 141 valid individual ratings were available out of 144 possible ratings.

The mean teacher feedback score was 4.10 out of 5 (82.0%). Excellent and Very Good ratings together accounted for 73.76% of valid ratings, while 97.16% of ratings were Good or

above. No Poor rating was recorded. All 18 teachers (100%) recommended organizing similar programmes in the future.

The student feedback forms indicate a predominantly positive response, particularly concerning the relevance of the topic, understanding of the historical consequences of Partition, the speaker's knowledge and presentation, insight into refugee-related issues, usefulness of the programme and overall organization.

Set 4 contained five student forms and 40 ratings. Of these, 5 (12.5%) were Excellent, 34 (85.0%) Very Good and 1 (2.5%) Good. No Satisfactory or Poor rating was recorded in Set 4, and all five respondents recommended similar programmes.

Across the student feedback forms, written comments were predominantly positive. Participants referred to improved understanding of the Partition, its consequences, the sufferings and struggles of refugees, and the responsibilities associated with refugee issues.

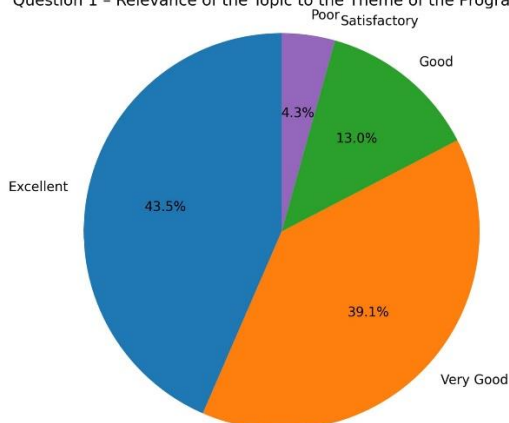

The feedback demonstrates that the programme was well received by both teachers and students. The strongest aspects were the academic relevance of the topic, the historical understanding gained by participants, the speaker's knowledge and presentation, and the humanitarian dimension of the discussion.

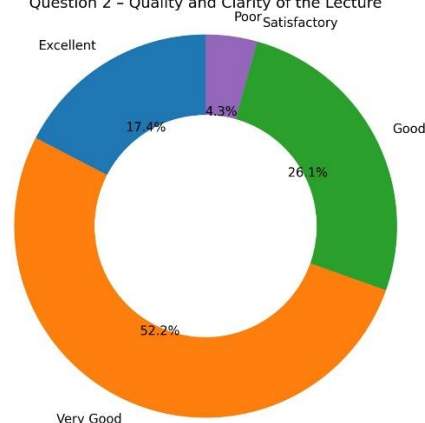
The feedback also indicates that the programme successfully connected the historical experience of Partition with the suffering of refugees and broader questions of social responsibility.

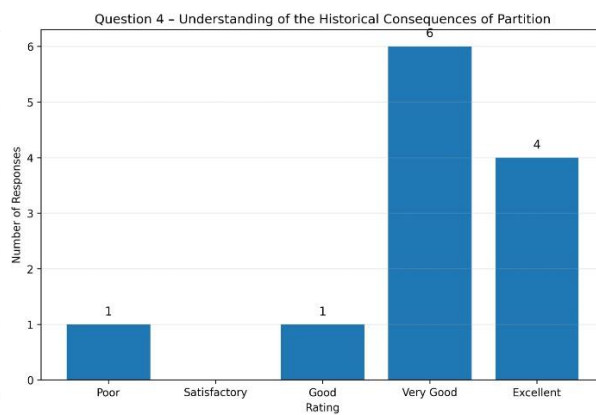
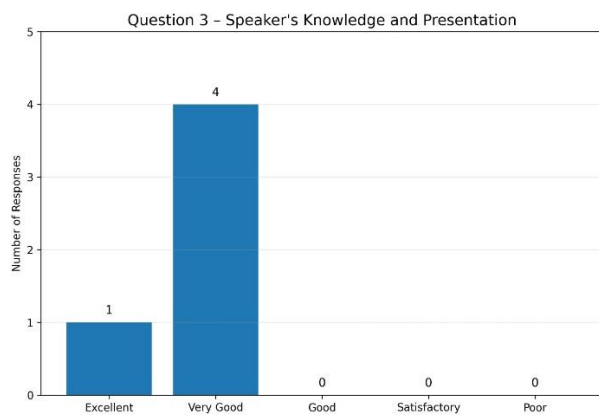

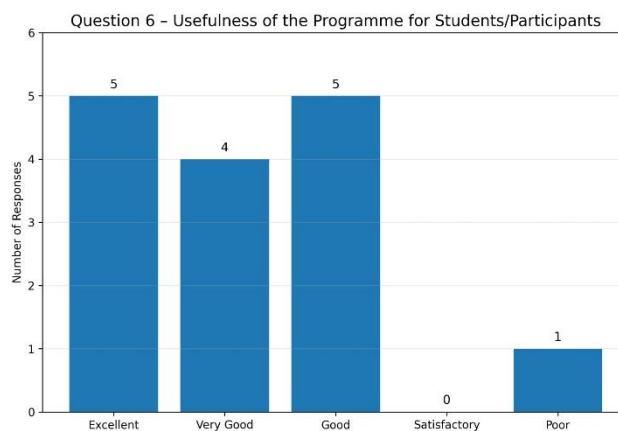
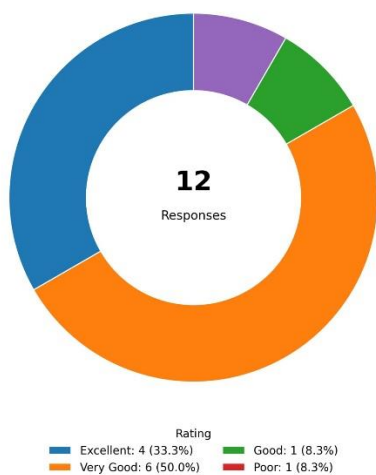


Question 2 – Quality and Clarity of the Lecture

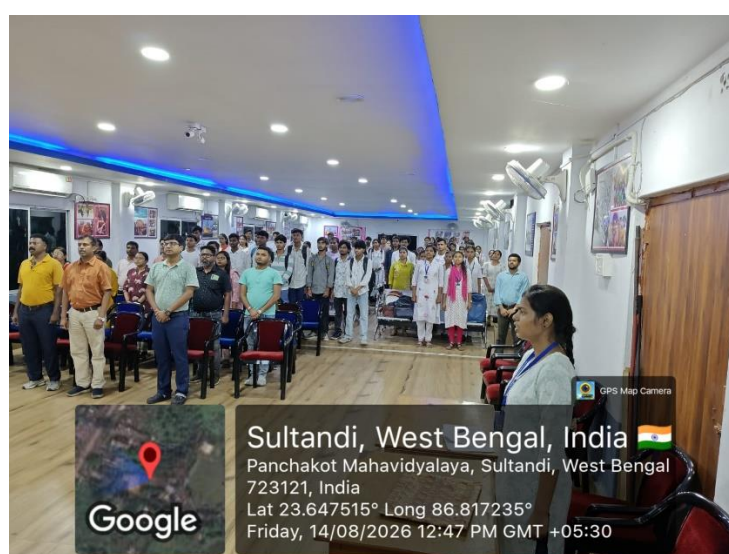

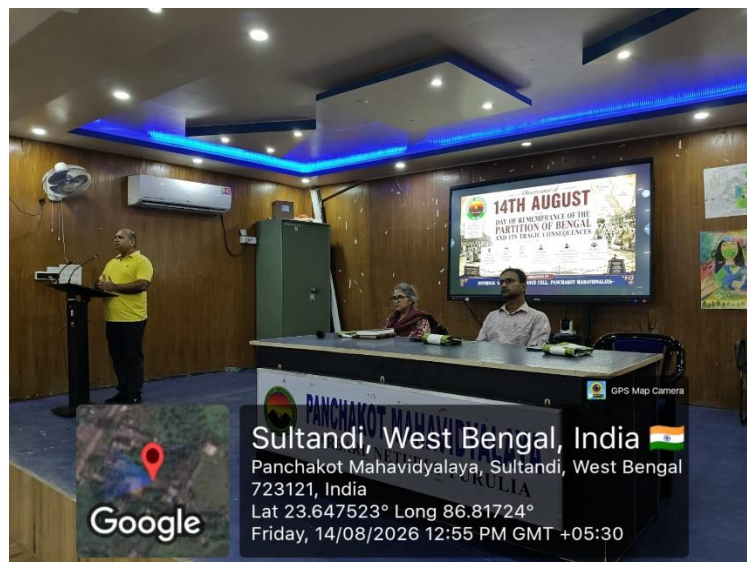
Singing of National Song



Singing of National Anthem



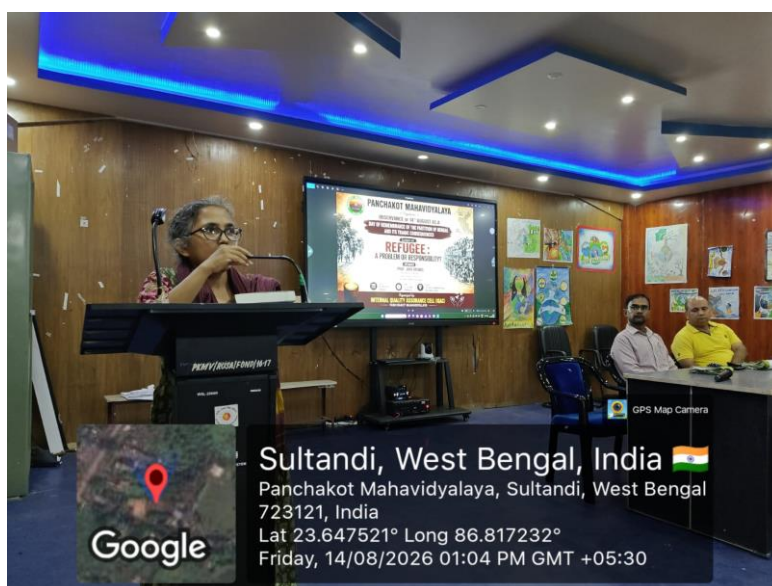
